

Vanity Fair – EXTRA

Level 3

This level is suitable for students who have been learning English for at least three years and up to four years. It corresponds with the Common European Framework level B1. Suitable for users of TEAM magazine.

SYNOPSIS

Amelia Sedley and Becky Sharp are best friends. Amelia comes from a wealthy City family and expects to marry George Osborne, a handsome army officer. Amelia is romantic, loyal and no judge of character. Becky has no family or money. She has looks, brains and big ambitions.

Becky plots her way through life, rising from governess to wife of aristocratic (but penniless) Rawdon Crawley. Becky is popular with the men in *Vanity Fair*, but unpopular with their wives.

Amelia's family fall on hard times when her father loses all his money in the City. Amelia and George marry, against his father's wishes. After only a few weeks they go to Brussels for the war with Napoleon. George has fallen in love with Becky and wants to run off with her. But the men are called to battle. George is killed at the Battle of Waterloo. Dobbin is in love with Amelia, but she thinks only of George. She gives birth to George's son. They are very poor, living on money that Dobbin secretly sends. Becky has a son too. She has no maternal feelings, and the child is left in the care of his father.

A powerful man, Lord Steyne, becomes interested in Becky. There is a scandal, and Rawdon leaves her. Becky is ruined and flees to Europe. There, she meets Amelia and Dobbin by chance. She reveals to Amelia that George was in love with her, which releases Amelia to love Dobbin.

Amelia and Dobbin marry and have a daughter. Becky lives alone but in comfort.

THE BACK STORY

William Makepeace Thackeray was born in India in 1811. Soon after, his father died and he was sent to school in England at the age of four. He went to Cambridge University, but he didn't work hard, gambled away his fortune and left university without a degree. After he married Isabella Shawe in 1837, he needed to make some money and he started writing. He wrote poems, novels, magazine columns and, in 1847–8, *Vanity Fair*. The feisty Becky Sharp, heroine of the novel, was a great success with the public, and has remained a favourite character ever since.

Thackeray's novel, *Vanity Fair*, is more than 800 pages long. It has been filmed many times for television and the cinema.

The story mixes fiction and fact, with many characters based on real socialites known to Thackeray, and others on historical characters like Napoleon and the Duke of Wellington. The characters negotiate their way through real historical events, such as the stock market crash of 1815, and the Battle of Waterloo.

HOW TO USE YOUR SCHOLASTIC READER

Choosing and motivating

Is this the right story for your class? Have the students seen the film version of *Vanity Fair* starring Reese Witherspoon? Motivate them by reading aloud the first page of the story with dramatic atmosphere or playing the first chapter on the CD.

Organising

Plan a class reading schedule. Decide how many pages to set for reading each week. Select exercises from the Self-Study section at the back of the reader and extra activities from this resource sheet to go with each chunk of reading. (All the answers are on page 4 of this resource sheet.)

Using the CD

Students can listen and follow in their books. They can listen and then read. They can read and then listen. All these activities will improve their reading speeds and skills.

Using the DVD

Select the English language option on the DVD. The film is 135 minutes long. Select scenes to show in parallel with the class reading schedule, or show scenes when the class has finished the book, as a reward.

Glossary

Go to 'New Words' at the back of the reader. Translate the words with the class or get students to find meanings at home. The Vocabulary Builder on page 3 of this resource sheet practises the new words in a different context.

The language of Thackeray's time

Vanity Fair was published in 1847–8. This adaptation is mostly told in modern English, but keeps a flavour of the original. Read through page 6 of the reader to prepare students for the language they will come across.

Fact Files

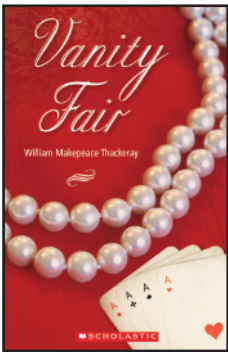
Set the Fact Files as self-study or use for whole class work. These provide background information about the writer, the historical background to the story and the lives of young gentlemen in Thackeray's day.

Students work in groups of three. One is a journalist. The other two are soldiers – one is French, one is English. Both fought at Waterloo. Students prepare questions and answers using the information on the page, in the story of *Vanity Fair*, in books or on the Internet. Students rehearse their interviews before performing them for the class. Example:

Interviewer: *Michel, you fought for Napoleon at Waterloo.*

Michel: *Yes, it was a terrible battle.*

Interviewer: *When did it start?*

Michel: *It started on 18 June.*
