Talking Tess' Tasty Tomatoes

You will need:

3 large ripe tomatoes 1/2 tsp brown sugar 2 tbsp of olive oil 1/2 small onion 1 garlic glove 1/2 red pepper 100g couscous 50g feta cheese





1 Ask an adult to preheat the oven to 180°C. Slice about 1cm from the tomato bases and keep them. Finely chop the onion, pepper and garlic.



4 Add the onion and garlic and stir occasionally, until the onion is soft. Then add the chopped pepper and cook for about three minutes. Turn off the heat.



2 Using a teaspoon, scoop out the tomato seeds over a bowl. Keep all the seeds and juice you scoop out.



3 Sprinkle the sugar inside the tomatoes. Ask an adult to heat the olive oil in a frying pan over a medium heat.



5 Add the couscous, the **6** Spoon the mixture into tomato pulp and 100ml of tomatoes and top with the boiling water to the pan. tomato bases. Put them Stir. then cover and leave on a baking tray and brush for five minutes. Crumble with olive oil. Bake for in the feta and mix gently. 20-25 minutes. Terrific!

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Talking Tess

Introduce Talking Tess and her phoneme 't' by playing her song (available to download from www.scholastic.co.uk/ childedplus). Then read the following story to the children: I'm Talking Tess and I'm a very busy person. I'm in charge of all the telephones and televisions in Letterland

and I know how to fix them, too! Every morning I take the train to my job in the Teletouch Tower. My job is keeping everyone in touch with each other. It's a terrific job because I get to talk to people all day long. Talking! Talking! On the telephone!

Ask the children to introduce themselves to Talking Tess. Encourage them to role play talking to her on the telephone, telling her about themselves.

Brainteasers

Tell the children that in her free time Talking Tess often goes on talking on the telephone! That's because she likes to exchange brainteasers with her friends. Invite the children to take turns being Tess and ask, What has four legs but can't walk, and it begins with my sound? (Table or her teddy bear.) What has poles, lots of pegs and has my sound at both ends? (Tent.)

Ask the children to work with a partner and try to think of more words beginning with Tess' sound. Can they make a brainteaser with any of them? Praise their attempts with 't' words, such as Terrific! Tremendous! Top-notch!

Finish the exercise by giving the children one final brainteaser. Say, It's something round and red and tasty, and the word has two little t-sounds in it. Yes. a tomato! Let's look at Talkina Tess' Tasty Tomato recipe and see if we agree that it will be tasty!

Oscar & Peter's Olive Pizza

You will need:

Pizza base Tomato purée 125g mozzarella cheese 1/4 red and green peppers 1 tbsp sliced black olives Black pepper Parmesan for grating





1 Place a pizza base on a board. Squirt on some tomato purée and spread all over with a spoon. You could have fun making 'o' and 'p' shapes!



4 Now put the sliced olives on top. Look at the olive shapes – they are like little, tiny 'o's!



2 Shred the mozzarella

into small pieces and

sprinkle it on top.

5 Ask an adult to help you place the pizza on a baking tray and cook for 12 minutes at 220°C.

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3 Ask an adult to help you chop up some peppers into thin strips. Then place them in a pattern on top.



6 Peter Puppy likes to put a little black pepper and grated parmesan on his pizza. You could try that too. Perfect!

and his phoneme 'p'. Then tell the following story to the children: Hello, I'm Peter Puppy. I'm a Letterland puppy so I make a special sound in words. I love playing in the Letterland park,

Read out the following story and let the children fill in the blanks:

One day Peter Puppy put on a new pullover. It was his favourite colours, (children to guess pink and purple) with a big pocket in front. He put his paw in his pocket and pulled out a...? (Children can decide what he pulls out, starting with his sound. Welcome and list all ideas: a penny, pen, potato, packet of peanuts, pizza, parrot, plane, pony, paddling pool. parachute. whatever!)


Review the list asking, Is that possible or impossible? Let the children decide, because in Letterland all sorts of things are possible!
