## The Aztecs

From 1427 to 1521, the Aztecs controlled a large part of Central America. Their capital city, Tenochtitlan, was where Mexico City is today. Religion was very important to the Aztecs, and they built huge temples to their many gods. Aztec temples were pyramid-shaped with a flat top, just like the pyramid at Akator in *Indiana Jones and the Kingdom of the Crystal Skull*.

All Aztec children went to school, but very few people learnt to read and write. The Aztecs had a kind of picture writing which was very colourful but very difficult to use.

# CONQUISTADORS

## The Incas

From their capital city in Cuzco, Peru, the Incas controlled the area of present-day Peru, Bolivia, north Argentina, Chile, and Ecuador from 1438 to 1533.

The Incas had very good roads and amazing bridges across the valleys of the Andes mountains. They used knotted ropes called *quipu* to record information, but had no writing.

This strange-shaped skull, and others like it, were found in Paracas, Peru. Why is it such an unusual shape? No one can be sure.

## The Conquistadors

In the sixteenth century, the Spanish conquistadors (Spanish for 'conquerors') sailed across the Atlantic Ocean to search for land and gold in the New World. The Aztecs and Incas were good fighters, but they couldn't win against the Spanish.

The conquistadors had powerful weapons and horses. In a few short years, they had destroyed these two great civilisations.
