How to Create an Autumn Leaves Display

RESOURCES
You will need:
 A selection of different leaves
 Some paint – (red, yellow, brown, green and black)
 Paint brushes – (different sizes)
 Glue
 Twigs
 A pencil
 Paper
 Some felt-tips

PRINTED LEAVES
 Follow four easy steps to create an amazing autumn picture.

1. Choose a leaf and select a paint colour.
2. Paint one side of the leaf and then press it down on **your** sheet of paper.
3. Peel the leaf away carefully. **You will** see a leaf print left behind.
4. Repeat this action using different leaves and choosing different paint colours.

A FEATHERY OWL
 Use the same printing technique to create a fantastic feathery owl picture.

What to do:
First draw the owl's head, eyes and beak at the top of your paper.
Then use small leaves to print the feathers on the owl's body.
Next give your owl two printed feet.
Finally fix a twig along the bottom of your picture so your owl has something to perch on.

Now you are ready to display all your hard work!
