Q&A WITH JAMIE GREGORY

If you only had 10 seconds to convince someone to read *Bone Head: Guardian of the Underworld*, what would you say?

This book is the funny, chaotic diary of Demise aka Bone Head – a skeleton guard who works on the gates to Hades’ fortress – but the diary has been found by his supervisor, Mort, and he has a lot of snarky things he’d like to say. If you enjoy books like *Loki* and *Bunny vs Monkey*, you’ll enjoy this.

If your books had a “warning label,” what would it say? (E.g., May cause uncontrollable laughter)

Warning: Contains molten goo vomiting creatures, dragons and a very large three-headed dog.

When you’re drawing a character who is literally made of bones, how do you make them feel alive, expressive, and possibly even a bit mischievous?

This is a good question and is actually one of the main reasons the skellies in *Bone Head* have such large eyes and eyebrows. They don’t have moving mouths, which would normally limit how much expression you can get out of them. By playing around with pupil sizes, their eyelids and eyebrows, they’re able to show a lot of emotion.

How many doodles does it take before one becomes a real character and do any of your doodles ever refuse to behave?

I spend a lot of time on doodles before I settle on a character. The number of doodles varies though.

The golems went through quite a long process because at first I wanted them to be tall and very cool looking, but as the story developed the boulder shape made more sense.

The skellies are quite simple to do, and I play around with combinations of head shapes and eyes until they look right.

Cerberus was hard to get right, and he refused to behave for a long time. I wanted him to be simple to draw. Partly because I knew I’d have to draw his head three times in any picture he’s in, and partly

because I hoped kids would want to draw him and I didn’t want that to feel too complicated.

What inspired you to create *Bone Head: Guardian of the Underworld* and what was your favourite part of bringing this story to life?

I was inspired by a few things. Firstly, I doodled the main character Demise/Bone Head on a whim, and I thought he was cool and would appeal to kids. I spent a long time figuring out what to do with the character. Secondly, I really wanted as many kids as possible to feel like this book was for them so I created it with lots of visual appeal and two distinct character voices.



Did you ever read a book that made you laugh so much you couldn't stop and did that inspire you to make funny books too?

As a kid, *George's Marvelous Medicine* made me laugh out loud as the granny grew through the ceiling. More recently, I love Neil Cameron's brand of humour in *Donut Squad* as it's very snappy and appeals to both kids and adults. I think that books that make us smile and laugh really stay with us and that did inspire to me to write funny books.

Why do you think illustrated books and manga can be such a brilliant way to get people excited about reading?

Every day we're surrounded by visuals that are trying to appeal to us. This is why books have covers – because appealing pictures make us want to pick things up. To many people, a page of black and white text can feel a little daunting, so by adding illustrations we can make reading feel more enticing, exciting and make you want to pick that book up and read it.

Do you have any advice or tips for kids who love to draw or tell stories, and might like to become an author or illustrator one day, too?

For aspiring illustrators, the first thing is to keep practising. Draw for the love of it and try not to be a perfectionist. I used to be so careful with every line until I realised those little mistakes gave my drawings more personality. Also never stop creating your own characters. One day you might draw the next *Dog Man*.

For storytelling, my personal approach is to create characters and then think of the world that they would inhabit. Once those boundaries are set, it becomes far easier to think of scenarios that would occur. Even better, if you can think of a few characters and personalities within that world. You might start to see links or points of tension between them that you can play around with.
