

# PELÉ - EXTRA

## Level 1

This level is suitable for students who have been learning English for at least a year and up to two years. It corresponds with the Common European Framework level A1. Suitable for users of CLICK/CROWN magazines.

### SYNOPSIS

*Pelé* tells the story of the man who became the most famous footballer in the world, from his early days playing on the streets of his town in Brazil to his life and career after he retired from football.

Born in the small Brazilian town of Três Corações in 1940, Edson Arantes do Nascimento was known to his family by the nickname 'Dico'. His father was a professional footballer, but injuries held him back in the sport. When Dico was 4, the family moved to Bauru.

The young Dico played football in the streets with his brother Zoca and the other children. By the time he was a teenager football was his life. Around this time he also had a new nickname – Pelé. He joined the youth team of the town's football club, BAC (his father's club). The team's manager recognised that Pelé was something special and arranged for Pelé to leave BAC and join the big club Santos.

At first, Pelé was homesick at Santos, but he played his first game for the club's first team at the age of 15. He scored in the game – the first of many goals for Santos. He became an important part of the first team, improving his skills and breaking records for numbers of goals. Pelé remained with Santos for most of his football career, making the club one of the most successful in the world.

Pelé was chosen for Brazil's 1958 World Cup team. Brazil won the cup in Sweden that year, and the world was amazed by the young Brazilian's abilities. Pelé also contributed to Brazil's victory

in the 1962 World Cup, although injuries kept him out of the tournament's later games. The 1966 World Cup in England was unhappy for Pelé. Some of the other teams decided to foul Pelé to stop him playing, and Brazil was quickly out of the tournament. However, Pelé was back at the 1970 World Cup in Mexico, helping his country to win the cup again.

By this time, Pelé was married with two children. In 1971 he retired from international football and in 1974 he played his last game for Santos. He spent the last years of his career playing for an American club, New York Cosmos, until he retired in 1977 at 37 years old.

Pelé and his first wife, Rosemeri, had one more child, but they separated soon after this. Pelé married his second wife in 1994 and they had two children. After playing professionally, Pelé was a television football commentator and even appeared in a movie with Sylvester Stallone. He promoted football and worked for different charities around the world, in particular helping children in poverty.

Set these as self-study or use for whole class work. There are also fact boxes on pages 9 and 14 of the main text. These provide background information about the country Brazil and about how the World Cup tournament works. The fact files at the end of the book focus on the history of the World Cup, the greatest footballers ever, and famous people and charity work.

### What did they think?



#### Role play

Ask students to read about Brazil on page 9. They should work in pairs. One of them works at the Brazilian tourist board; the other wants to go there for a visit. They should ask and answer about these things.

- cities and places
- languages
- the people
- history

### THE WORLD CUP (page 14 and pages 32–3)

#### Poster project

Students work in groups. Give them a few minutes to think of as many major international sporting competitions as they can, and ask them to make a list in their groups. (Examples might be Olympics, Winter Olympics, Grand Prix, Wimbledon). Compare each group's list as a class activity, and ask each group to choose one event. Each group should make a poster about their competition – why they like it/locations/best moments/the stars etc. When the posters are complete, each group can present their 'World's Greatest Sporting Event' to the class.

### FIVE OF THE BEST (pages 34–5)

#### Survey

Ask students to carry out a survey, asking as many people as possible the following question: 'Who was the best footballer in the world ever?' Students should find a good way to show the results of their survey – perhaps a pie chart. In small groups, they could pick one of the names on their survey (other than the five players in the Fact File) and research more about him.

#### Discussion

Students should work in groups to decide lists of Five of the Best in other areas. They might make their list about:

- another sport
- music
- acting

Remind students to justify their choices with reasons. Each group should present their final list to the class.

### CELEBRITY AND CHARITY (pages 36–7)

#### Debate

Some celebrities help to tell people about world problems. But some people think that celebrities can distract attention from those who know much more about these problems.

Ask students what they think. They should have a debate on the following topic:

*Celebrities are not the best people to tell others about world problems.*

Have one or two students give speeches for and against this sentence. Then let anyone else give their opinion. At the end of the debate, the students should vote: do they agree with the sentence or not?

#### Organize a charity event

Ask the class to choose a charity that they would like to donate to. Have them think of ways of raising money for that charity. Possible ideas include:

- a sponsored walk or run
- a sponsored read
- a sale or raffle

When students have completed the event, they can write a letter to the charity explaining what they did.

### CD FOLLOW-UP

#### Predicting

Stop the CD at key moments. What will happen next in Pelé's life. Ask the students to predict.

### Listening for key words

Choose two or three key words or phrases from a chapter of the reader. Ask students to write down one piece of information to go with each of the key words or phrases as they listen.

*Example:* 1. Waldemar de Brito 2. Rio de Janeiro.

*Possible answers:* 1. He was the manager of Pelé's youth team at Bauru Athletic Club. 2. A team in Rio wanted Pelé to join them, but his mother did not want him to go to the big city.
