The Scholastic Laugh Out Loud Book Awards (the Lollies) is created to celebrate the funniest children's books in the UK and Ireland.

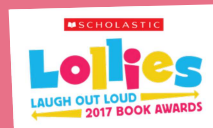
The **first-ever Lollies ceremony** takes place.

The **picture book winners, Michelle Robinson and Tor Freeman**, were presented their award on stage by **legendary children's author Julia Donaldson**.

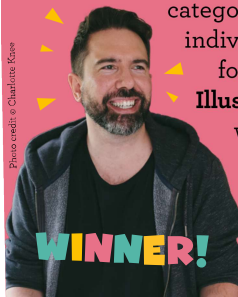

MEET THE 2026 LOLLIES JUDGES

Michael Rosen

Michael Rosen is one of the best-known figures in the children's book world. A former Children's Laureate, he is celebrated for his work as a poet, author, performer, broadcaster and scriptwriter. As an author and anthologist, Michael has been involved with over 140 books. He has been a Lollies ambassador and judge since it began 10 years ago!

Why are funny children's books so important?

I think funny books are amazingly important, I loved funny books as a child, they helped me get into reading! My brother used to read me funny books and I loved it, I used to sit on the other side of the bedroom laughing and wheezing away, I am a big spokesperson for funny books!

What's your favourite thing about being a children's author?

I think back to when I was a boy, and I get a great warm feeling of what it was like - reading books, writing stories, having laughs with my brother and my friends. I go back into that warm bubble of what it was to be the boy I was.

Jon Biddle is a primary school teacher and English lead, currently teaching at Moorlands Primary Academy in Norfolk. Jon is a passionate advocate of Reading for Pleasure. Jon also shares his practice through the Open University Reading for Pleasure site and continues to champion high-quality children's literature, having a particular love of graphic novels and poetry.

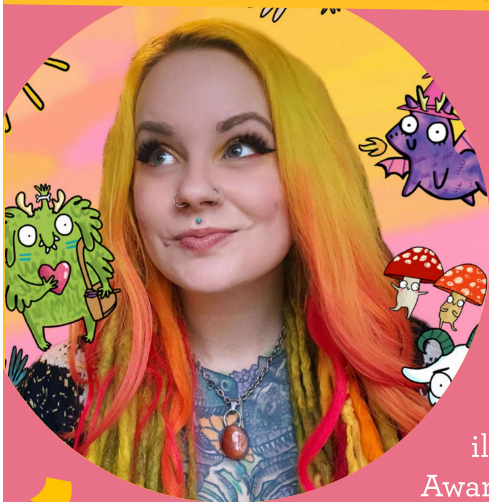
How have you found the Lollies judging?

It's been an absolute privilege to be a judge for the 10th anniversary of the Lollies! I think children need books that are funny – we know there's been a decline in reading for pleasure, but we also know that children love reading funny books and that they're the books that get them talking to each other about books and stories.

What's your favourite thing about funny children's books?

My favourite thing is how they help to build a community in the classroom. They teach children so many things: empathy, representation, there are so many powerful messages from children's books – they're also just lots of fun to read. Class story time is the highlight of the day in my class.





Katie Abey

Katie Abey is a creative human committed to the idea that she might just be able to make a positive difference to the world by drawing perturbed animals and lots of rainbows for a living. Her work is created to uplift and feel supportive, and she is passionate about making people feel proud of their individuality and all the things that set them apart from others. Alongside building her brand and merchandise, Katie has illustrated 50 children's books and counting. Katie won The Lollies Award for 9–12-year-olds for *'How to Survive Time Travel'* in 2024.

How have you found the Lollies judging?

It's been really fun! I feel like as judges, we're all on the same wavelength and it's an honour to have the chance to read so many funny children's books – it's been so inspiring!

What's your favourite thing about funny children's books?

I love that they're whole worlds and that they provide escapism – I think they're really important. Especially funny children's books, as they're so accessible and it's what children want to read.

Alex Falase-Koya

Children's author Alex has been reading and writing since he was a teenager. His debut novel *'Marv and the Mega Robot'* was inspired after Alex struggled to find superheroes in fiction who looked like him. By creating Marv, a superhero whose strengths are kindness and imagination, Alex hopes to have created a character to whom all children can relate. He is also the co-writer of Marcus Rashford's *'The Breakfast Club Adventures'*. A previous winner of Spread the Word's 2019 London's Writers Awards for YA and Children's, Alex lives in Honor Oak with his two cats.

Why are funny children's books so important?

I think that children's books are super important and one of the cool things about children's books, is that you're able to be really out there and funny, and I think it's important to have an award that rewards being funny.

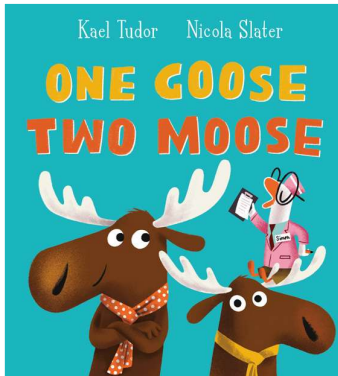
What's your favourite thing about being a children's author?

One Goose, Two Moose by Kael Tudor and Nicola Slater

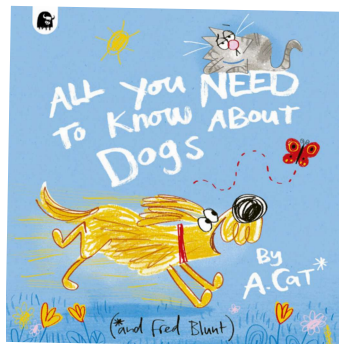
OK, everyone, line up!

My Rice is Best is a mesme-ricing celebration of food, culture and friendship!

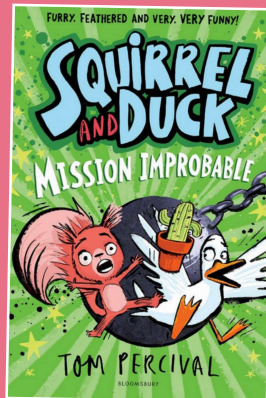
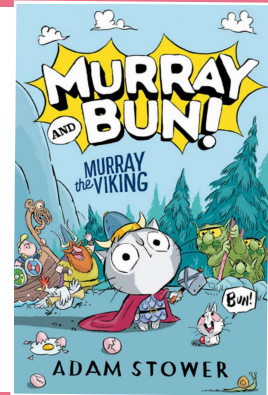




Murray and Bun: Murray the Viking by Adam Stower

The Notwitches by Gary Panton and Dotty Sutton

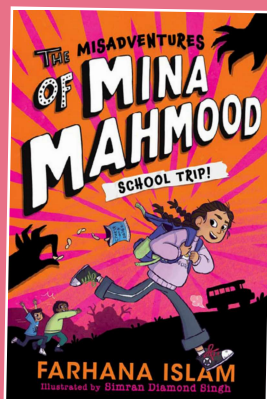
While lots of children have one or two problems, Melanda Notwitch has three: her horrible aunts. They really are the absolute WORST!

- With laugh-out-loud funny illustrations from Dotty Sutton



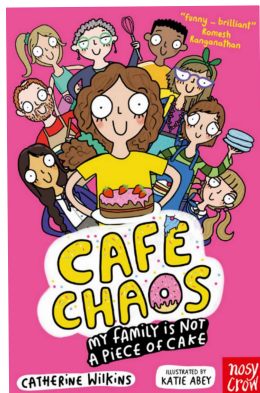
The Misadventures of Mina Mahmood: School Trip! by Farhana Islam and Simran Diamond Singh

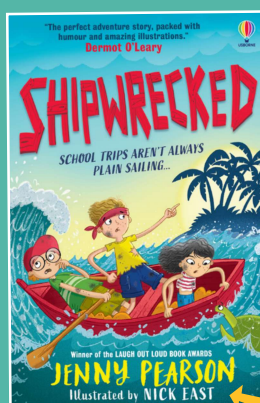


Café Chaos: My Family Is Not a Piece of Cake by Catherine Wilkins and Katie Abey

Nina Peanut is Amazing by Sarah Bowie

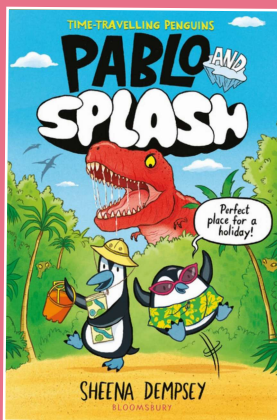
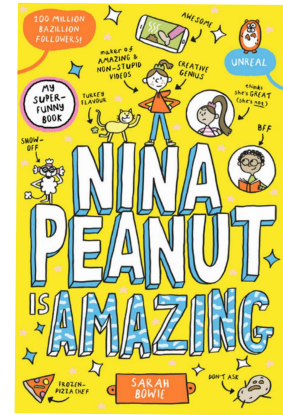
