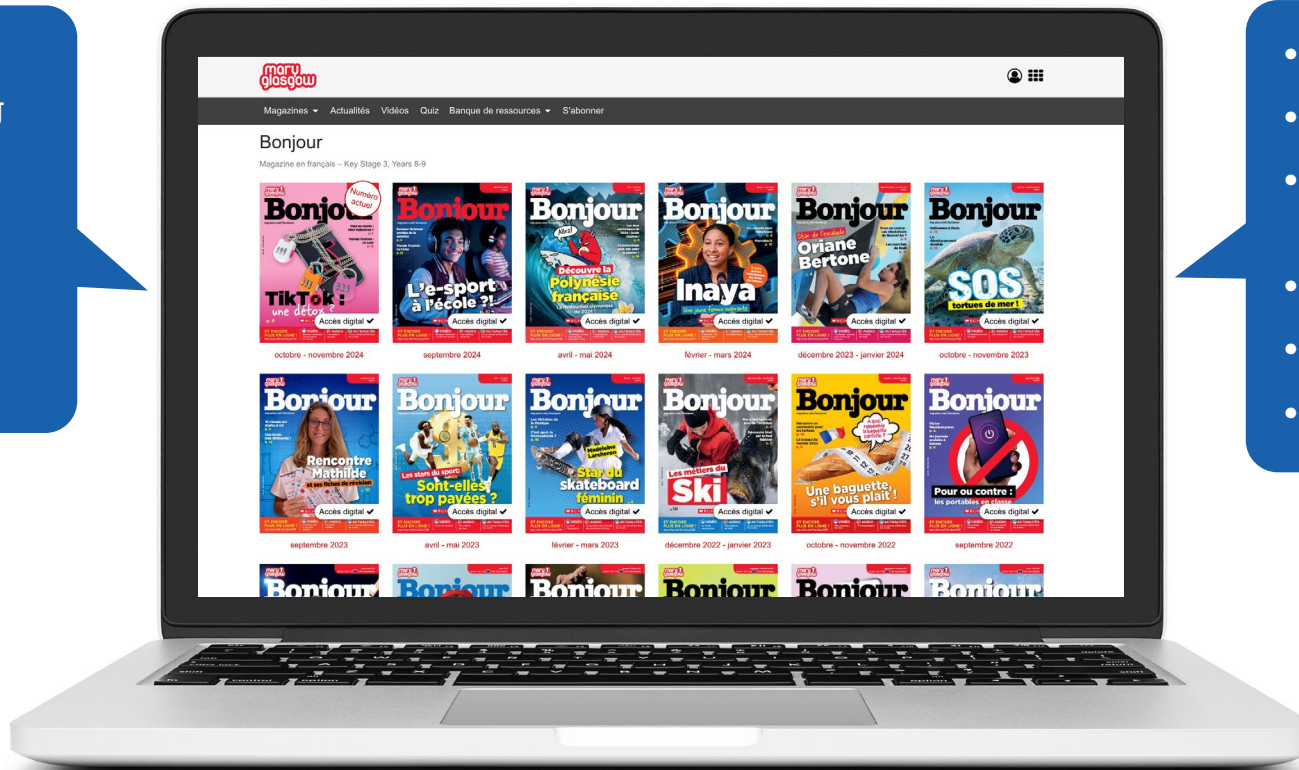

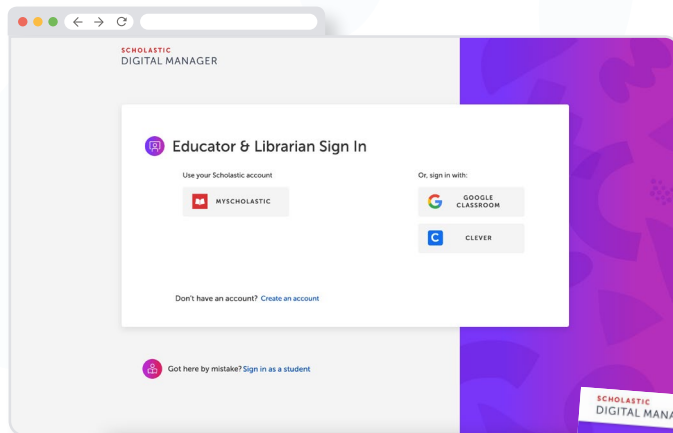

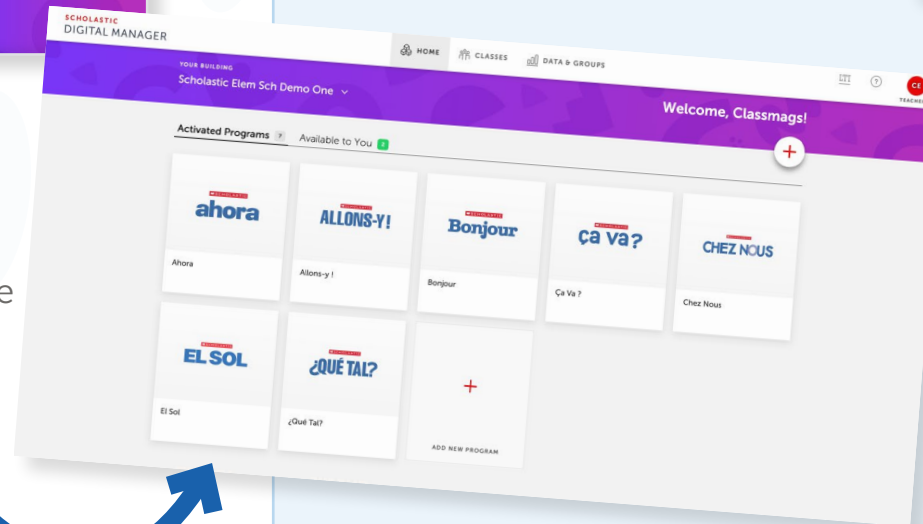
## How to enter the website

- 1 Go to [maryglasgowplus.com](https://maryglasgowplus.com)  
Click '**Register**' or '**Log in**'. You will be redirected to [digital.scholastic.com/teacher](https://digital.scholastic.com/teacher).



- 2 Click '**Create an account**' to register for the first time. If you have a Scholastic login, click '**MYSCHOLASTIC**' to sign in, or use the login buttons for Google Classroom or Clever if your school uses those platforms.

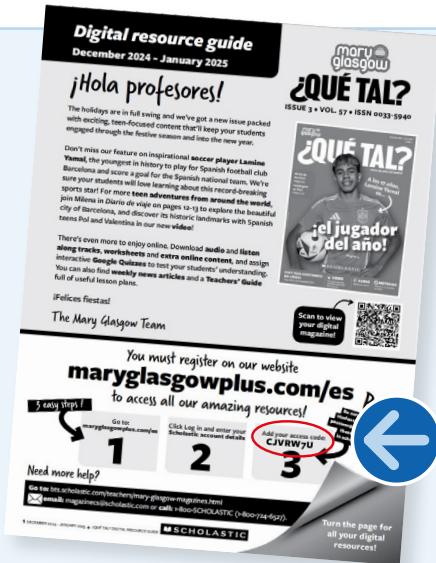
- 3 To add a new magazine, click the **+** symbol, then '**Add new magazine**' and enter the access code for that title.



### Where is my access code?

All teachers who subscribe to Mary Glasgow Magazines receive a free access code to give you access to our online resources. There is a separate code for each title. It is possible to enter more than one access code to access multiple titles and languages.

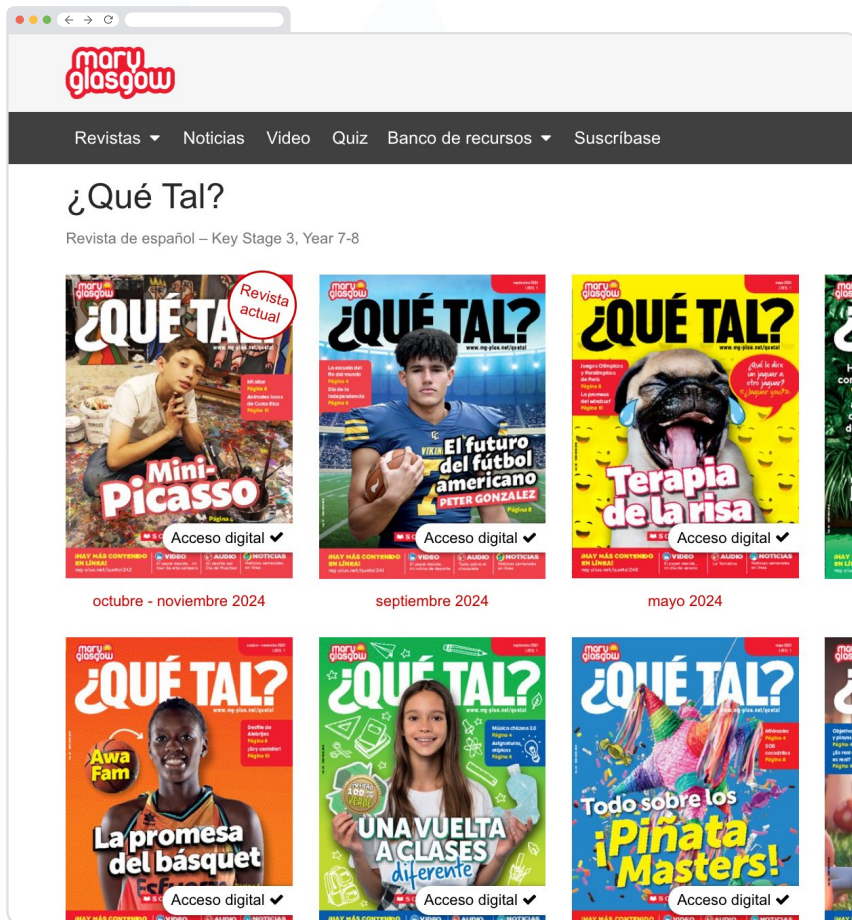
Your teacher code can be found on the **Digital Resource Guide** that we deliver with each magazine.



### How do students log in?

In the Scholastic Digital Manager, click '**Classes**' to view and add student information. To find students' login information, click their class then click their name. You can also download and print class login information by clicking '**Get login info**'.

- 5 Choose an issue to view your digital magazine and online resources.



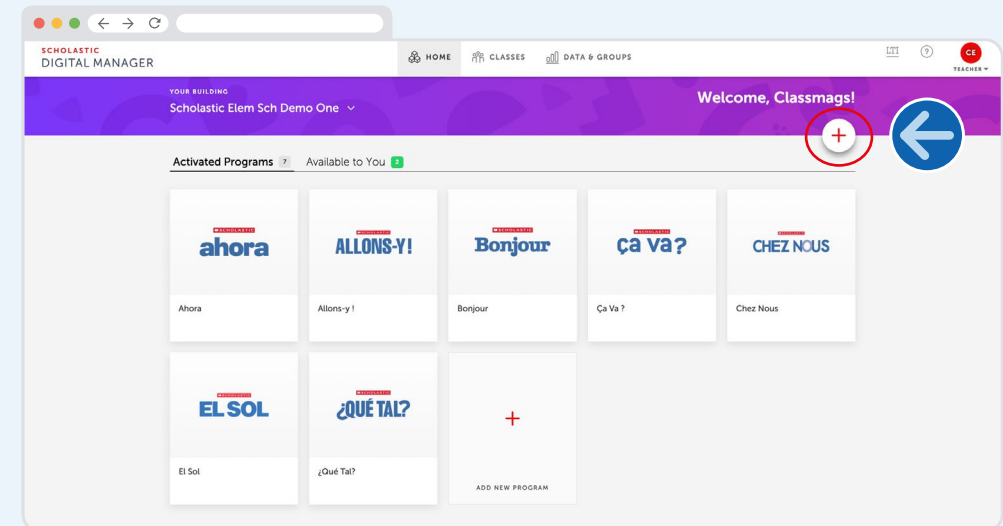
**Important:** Remember the password that you choose. You cannot use your account without it. Your password can be anything; it does not have to be the teacher/student code.

## Teachers and students with an account from last year

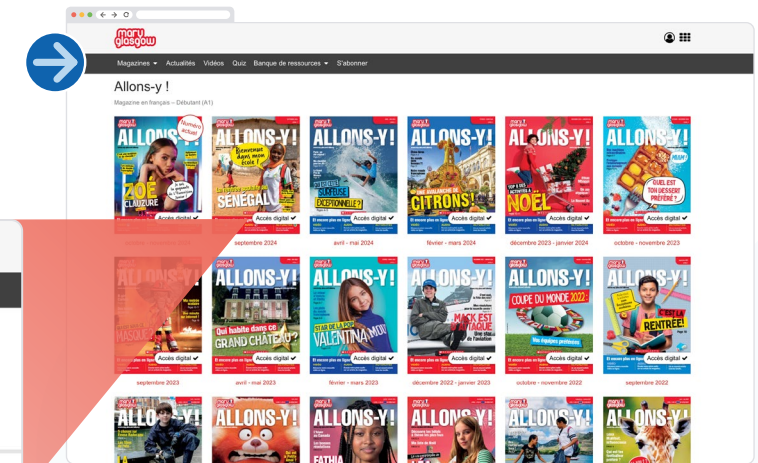

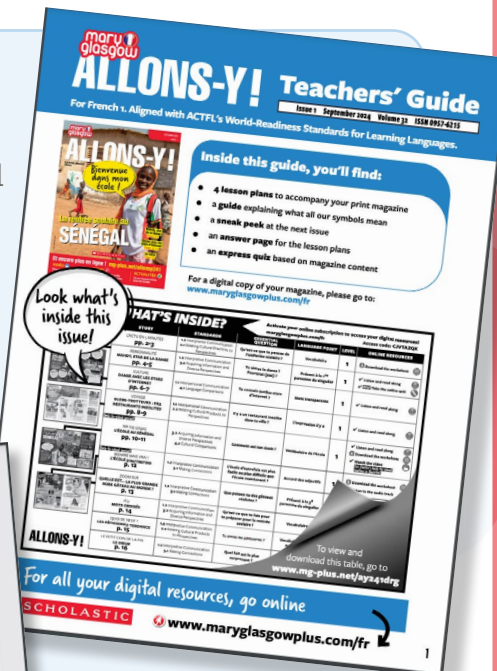

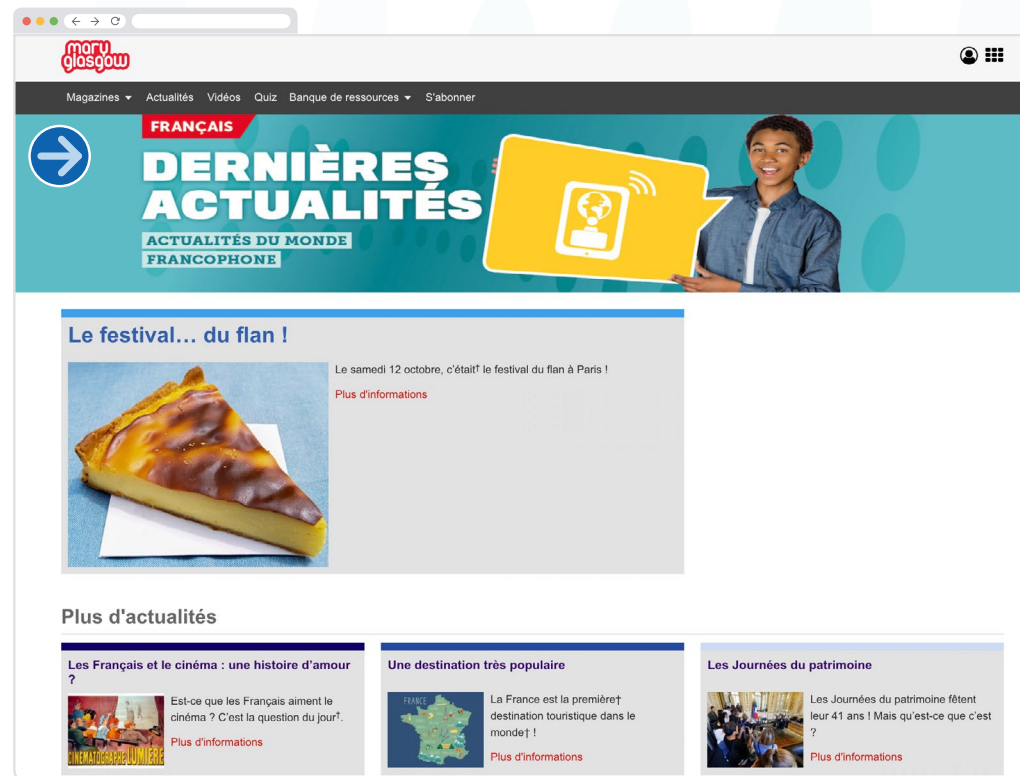

## Latest News

## Activity idea

3. Students write their answers to the questions or discuss them aloud in class.
