for 15-Minute Practice Papers (ages 9–10)

Practice Paper 1

1	Line 3 states that water makes up nearly two-thirds of our bodies', so 60% is the nearest option.
2	Line 4 states that 'In space, fluids, including blood, rise up into the skull, puffing it up.'
3	'deteriorate' has the same meaning as 'atrophy' in the context of body tissue getting weaker. Although in other contexts 'disintegrate' has a very similar meaning, but implies that something falls into pieces, which is not the case with weakening limbs.
4	In line 9, it states that 'the most serious issue is radiation. For without the protection of our atmosphere, space travellers are exposed to harmful doses that increase their chances of getting cancer' Therefore cancer is caused by exposure to radiation, which is not related to reduced gravity.
5	Line 9 states that 'the most serious issue is radiation. For without the protection of our atmosphere, space travellers are exposed to harmful doses'. Therefore it is usually the atmosphere that shields people from radiation.
6	In lines 15 & 16 it states that the longest time spent in space is 438 days. One year of 12 months is 365 days. $438 - 365 = 71$. A month is about 30 days. $30 \times 2 = 60$, so 71 is a bit more than 2 months. Therefore the answer is $12 + 2$ months = approximately 14 months.
7	The whole article explains the challenging physical effects of space travel on the human body. Paragraph 6 refers to investigations into physical and psychological impacts, and refers to the 'the trials that will lie ahead' for travellers to Mars. Therefore 'ardous in the extreme' must reflect these intense difficulties and challenges.
8	Two tickets would cost $\pounds 81.45 \times 2 = \pounds 162.90$. Rounding to the nearest $\pounds 10$ would be $\pounds 160$.
9	A return ticket (travelling there and back) would cost $\pounds 68.55 \times 2 = \pounds 137.10$. Rounding to the nearest $\pounds 10$ would be $\pounds 140$.
10	Four tickets would cost $\pounds 103.60 \times 4 = \pounds 410.40$. Rounding to the nearest $\pounds 10$ would be $\pounds 410$.
