<i>Pride and Prejudice</i> by Jane Austen	<p>Read Chapter 56 from 'Not so hasty' to 'contempt of the world'. How does Austen present attitudes towards social status in <i>Pride and Prejudice</i>.</p> <p>Write about:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • how Austen presents attitudes towards social status in this extract • how Austen presents attitudes towards social status in the novel as a whole.
<i>A Christmas Carol</i> by Charles Dickens	<p>Read from Stave 2: The First of the Three Spirits when Scrooge's sister comes to bring him home from 'It opened; and a little girl' to 'accompanied her.'
