

CREATE A FANTASY STORY

Here are some ideas for writing and drawing your own fantasy stories.

- 1. Start by drawing a map. Put in ordinary things like the sea, mountains and rivers. Then add fantasy details: enchanted forests, ice palaces, mermaid lakes and haunted caverns! Think about what might happen in these places it could help you come up with ideas for stories and characters.
- 2. Next, start making some characters. Use the words in the box as inspiration to create your own hero and villain. Try combining two or more words, for example King + Goblin + Wizard to make a powerful magical ruler of a goblin kingdom.


Write a few sentences describing them. Think about what they might wear, where they live and what their personality is like.

Perhaps a dragon, or a forest full of giant spiders, or a band of trolls! How does your hero overcome the obstacles to complete the quest? Do they have help? Make your story exciting and decide how you want it to end. Does your hero complete the quest?
