

Extended answers for 15-Minute Practice Papers (ages 10–11)

Practice Paper 1

1	In line 2 'such errors...have affected the course and outcomes of many matches.'
2	In line 5 'In 2018, the Video Assistant Referee (VAR) system was inaugurated' and in paragraph 5 'Change came to the Wimbledon tennis championship in 2007 with the introduction of Hawk-Eye'. $2018 - 2007 = 11$.
3	In lines 5 and 6 VAR was introduced 'at an FA Cup match between Brighton & Hove Albion and Crystal Palace' and 'football officials' could use it to review decisions.
4	In lines 7 and 8 football officials could 'reconsider and then overturn any incorrect decisions'. To 'overturn' a decision is to change the decision. The actual rules were not changed, just the rulings.
5	In line 13 'Spectators, justifiably so, were frustrated when bad calls were upheld.' 'Justifiably so' expresses agreement.
6	In line 17 'cameras angles to calculate the trajectory of the ball'. 'Size' would not be relevant to line calls and would not need calculating as the size does not change or affect the line calls. Also 'analysis' and 'image' do not relate to calculating angles. Calculating angles implies analysing movement of the ball, which is the only changing factor. Therefore 'pathway', which means the route of movement, makes sense in the context.
7	Lines 10 and 11 explain that technology may have replaced old problems with new ones, such as 'how long the reviews take and how reviews interrupt play'. By implication similar problems apply in tennis. In lines 18 and 19 'overuse could become a problem' suggests how issues occur if there is not enough control over something. Three of the answers are true, because they related to these factors, but nothing is said about power supply to the technology.

15	If all the pictures are rotated, all the double-headed shapes face the same way, apart from in A, where it has been flipped horizontally.
16	The ratio 2:1 means there are three portions. $£84 \div 3 = £28$, so the larger amount is $£28 \times 2 = 56$. Therefore the answer is B.
17	$\frac{1}{8}$ is equal to 0.125. Therefore the answer is C.
18	4005 is not divisible by 10 exactly because the number ends with a 5. Therefore the answer is E.
19	$2.4\text{km} = 2400\text{m}$. $2400\text{m} + 450\text{m} = 2850\text{m}$. Therefore the answer is B.
20	The sides of the square measure 3cm, so the area is $3\text{cm} \times 3\text{cm} = 9\text{cm}^2$. Therefore the answer is D.
21	43% of $400 = 172$. Therefore the answer is A.
22	58.084 rounded to 1 decimal place is 58.1. Therefore the answer is D.
23	The word 'affection' means 'a feeling of fondness for someone or something', therefore the correct answer is D.
24	The word 'debris' means 'the scattered remains of something', therefore the correct answer is H.

Option C is not correct as there is no striped shading in within the picture. Option D is incorrect as the stripes are running in the wrong direction. Therefore the correct answer is E.
15	The shapes within the pictures are reflected. Therefore the correct answer is C.
16	174 is the only number exactly divisible by 6. Therefore the answer is C.
17	If 20% is 35, then 35×5 will give the answer (175). Therefore the answer is E.
18	IX. Therefore the answer is B.
19	The only number that is not a factor of 64 is 6. Therefore the answer is A.
20	The range of the numbers can be found by subtracting the smallest number from the largest. $140 - 1 = 139$. Therefore the answer is D.

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21	If the mean of three numbers is 7, this means that the three numbers must total 21. $21 - (2+11) = 8$. Therefore the answer is C.
22	20% of £33.00 = £6.60. $£33.00 + £6.60 = £39.60$. Therefore the answer is B.
