Think! What impression do the stage directions at the start of Act One give about the Birlings as a family?	<p>The furniture shows the Birlings' wealth.</p> <p>“...substantial and heavily comfortable, but not cosy and homelike.”</p> <p>“...pink and intimate...brighter and harder.”</p> <p>Hints they are not close and there may be hidden tensions.</p> <p>The atmosphere changes through the use of lighting with the Inspector's arrival.</p> <p>DO IT! Find evidence from the opening two to three pages of the play that there are hidden tensions within the Birling family.</p>

Themes	Families
Think! What view of a typical Edwardian upper-class family does Priestley give his audience?	<p>Appearances and reputation are important for the Birlings.</p> <p>Beneath the surface, the family members are not close.</p> <p>DO IT! Find examples from the play that reflect the following expectations:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Men were 'heads' of the family.• Women were expected to follow the lead of their men.• Children were raised to be respectful to their elders.
