② Why was a new cathedral needed? – **The old cathedral had been destroyed by the Great Fire of London in 1666.**

③ Who designed St Paul's? – **Sir Christopher Wren**

④ How high is the Golden Gallery? – **85.4 metres**

⑤ Where in the cathedral is Wellington's monument? – **The north aisle**

⑥ What are the weights of the smallest (Treble) and largest (Tenor) bells? – **Just over half a ton and over 3 tons**

⑦ How many adults are there in St Paul's present day choir? – **18**

⑧ How many steps are there from the ground up to the Whispering Gallery? – **259**

⑨ Who rebuilt the cathedral's organ in 1872? – **Henry Willis**

⑩ Where in the crypt can Admiral Nelson's coffin be found? **Directly beneath the middle of the dome**

⑪ Which chapel can be found in the apse? – **The American Memorial Chapel**

⑫ What was the date of the first service held in the cathedral? – **2 December 1697**
